



Assistance For Urinating

The Little John Portable Urinal

- ◆ I used a Little John for many years when I was a pilot setting in the pilot's chair. A restroom is hard to find when flying cross country at 10,000 feet. It was a life saver.
- ◆ When they get older, most men must urinate more often and thus must frequently run to a bathroom or quickly find a restroom when traveling. In these situations, a Little John can be a life saver. Even at home, a Little John can prevent many inconvenient trips to the bathroom.
You can dump a Little John anywhere there is a wastewater receptacle, a toilet, or a sink. Whether you use a toilet or a sink, the urine goes to the same place, which is a sewer treatment plant or your septic tank. After using a Little John rinse it out. If you like, squirt in a little liquid soap in with the rinse water, shake it around and dump it. If you have dumped it in a sink, **vigorously rinse the sink.**
- ◆ I have a Little John in my car and three in critical locations in my house.
- ◆ To use it when traveling. I keep it on the floor just inside the driver-side back door. With the driver's side back door open, I face the inside of the car and stand as close to the car as possible. Then I close the door against my back and use my Little John. Thus, no one can see what I am doing.
On Interstate highways, I pull off on the shoulder as far as I can and use my Little John as described above. Cars going by at 70 miles per hour have no idea what I am doing. Sure saves finding a rest room, which may be twenty miles away at the next exit.
